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JUST-CRS Project WP 7: Students' Selection

The overall aim of this work package is to serve as a quality gatekeeper for the selection of prospective students into the program.

The specific aims of this work package are is to ensure the enrolment of highly competent students who can cope with and succeed on the course of the new master program, and to promote transparent selection of quality candidates.

This work package intends to establish a selection criteria based on the discussion with our Jordanian and European partners of the JUST-CRS consortium, all the while abiding with the overall rules and regulations that are implemented by the Deanship of Graduate Studies at Jordan University of Science & Technology.

The students' selection process will be composed of two phases:

- 1. To develop and identify the students' selection policy, criteria and guidelines.
- 2. To carry out the student's selection process.





JUST-CRS Students' Selection Policy

JUST – CRS program does not discriminate against any applicant based on nationality, race, gender, socioeconomic background or disability status. JUST-CRS adopts high standards' requirements for its applicants that are solely based on academic and professional merits and experiences.

Who are JUST-CRS Professional Targets?

JUST-CRS is targeting prospective applicants with following qualifications:

- Outstanding academic performance in their bachelor degree (Occupational therapy and physical therapy).
- 2) Extensive clinical experience (Preferred)
- Extensive Professional Development Portfolio (PDP) which includes academic, research and continuous professional (Preferred)





JUST-CRS Students' Selection Criteria

- a) Prospective students will be ranked on a scale of 100 using the following parameters:
 - 1. GPA on certificate of high school (10%) [Points obtained= GPA in high school*0.1]
 - 2. GPA on Bsc (60%) [Points obtained= GPA in BSc*0.6]
 - 3. The international ranking and classification of the university in which the student has obtained the degree from (10%):

- b) The top **<u>10</u>** ranked students will be selected for enrolment. The other students will be put on the waiting list in case some students declined admission or dropped.
- c) In case of a decision is needed to select in between two students or more (at the end of the list), an interview will be made.
- d) In case of an interview, a preset list of questions that will objectively classify the students will be conducted.
- e) JUST guidelines of English language proficiency will be adopted during admission (through Deanship of Graduate Studies), but TOEFL or ILETS grades will be used as a weighted parameter for selection.
